New Year, New Sister Church Visits

Groups throughout the North East District are planning trips to Cuba. Ortega UMC and Ponte Vedra UMC will be sending groups to District Conferences in Havana and Mayabeque. Linda Zelenka and Pearl Boles will be returning to Cuba from Orange Park UMC to visit Santa Fe. In March, Ponte Vedra will be sending a youth group to visit La Sierra, and Pastor Jeff McClendon (Dinsmore UMC) will make his first trip to visit La Europa in the Artemisa District.

In the past, all of our travel to Cuba was on charter flights. This fall, U.S. airlines began regularly scheduled service to Cuba. You can now fly on American, Delta, JetBlue, Southwest, and others from airports in Miami, Ft. Lauderdale, Orlando, and Tampa. There is even talk of service out of

Jacksonville. The net result of the increased service has been a decrease in air fares, with some promotional flights offered at \$100.

Travelers are using a mix of religious visas and tourist visas. Remember that the religious visas require at least 90 days to arrange. If you are ready to travel, let us know and we will walk you through the arrangements.

Cuba Task Force Welcomes Bishop Pereira, Ricardo, and Merly

The Cuba Task Force which coordinates Methodists United in Prayer throughout the Florida Conference met in Lakeland in October for their regular fall meeting. Bishop Ricardo Pereira, his son Ricardo, Jr. who is the church's statistician, and the Bishop's assistant, Merly Morejón, attended. Bishop Carter's representative, Alex Shanks, welcomed the group on behalf of the Florida Conference.

Bishop Pereira recalled Bishop Carter's first visit to Cuba and how the bonds of the ministry have strengthened. "The Cuba church is very grateful for the sister relationships and the help for pastors that has been ongoing from this ministry and wishes that a day will come when all the Methodist churches in Cuba will have a partnership with a church in Florida." The group provided hurricane

relief funds for the Bishop to take back to Cuba.

Ricardo, Jr. noted that in the last 15 years, coinciding with the MUIP relationship (and contributing to the churches' growth), the Methodist Church in Cuba has quadrupled in size with the number of members now about 43,200; attendance to worship about 60,000; 408 churches and 950 missions. The goal is to have a church

or worship center in each Cuba municipality. Currently they are at 99% of their goal.

Methodists United in Prayer celebrates its 20th anniversary at this year's Florida Annual Conference. There will be a pre-conference session with the Bishop on Wednesday, June 7, a celebration dinner on Thursday at St. Luke UMC, and the Bishop will preach on Friday ("Revive Us Again!).

Pastors Javier and Kimy Visit District

Pastor Kimy Bravo (10 de Octubre) and wife Yoneisi returned to St. Augustine in November, their second visit. He once again preached at Grace UMC and First UMC (St. Augustine). Pete Royal coordinated their visit.

Pastor Javier Ramos was in southwest Florida on a non-*MUIP* visit, but traveled to our District to meet with George Reed, the *MUIP* coordinator.

Javier's church, Calabazar, was planted in 2015, and was recently paired up with Fleming Island UMC in a sister church relationship. Thanks to Pastor Heather Harding for making this happen. The church is already planning a trip to Cuba. We pray God's blessing on the new arrangement!


Christmas Blessings from Ponte Vedra UMC


What he was told

outreach for the Southwest District Mission Program in Cuba was launched.

Agape Flights is a Christian-based cargo service based in Venice, Fla. A private donor paid all transportation costs to deliver purification units.

Thanks to countless and dogged hours of work and negotiation by Christopherson and his wife, Janetalong with more than a little prayer and the help of many others—26 water purification systems were delivered to rural churches in Cuba.












Bishop Pereira comforts victim of Hurricane Matthew
